## A Goodnow Brothers Elementary School? Officials recommend new school to be named for three brothers killed in Civil War

The City Code of the town of Marlborough, MA, specifies that all new schools, parks, streets or public buildings under its jurisdiction must be named for deceased Marlborough veterans. Three brothers from Marlborough -- Andrew, Charles and Theodore Goodnow - enlisted, served and died during the American Civil War (1861-65). A new Elementary School has been built in Marlborough and will open in September; the proposed name is the Goodnow Brothers Elementary School. Each brother is briefly profiled, as is their one brother who survived the war, James H. Goodnow.

# Deane Berg, Goodenow Descendant and Whistle-Blower

Deane Berg, the daughter of GFA member George Martel, shared the story of her ground-breaking and successful lawsuit against Johnson & Johnson for negligence in selling a

product that increases the risk of developing ovarian cancer. After being diagnosed with ovarian cancer at an unusually young age and with no known risk factors, she began studying medical texts to try to determine what might have caused her cancer. To her horror, she discovered that talcum powder use was linked to ovarian cancer, and, as a long-time user of Johnson & Johnson Baby Powder, she agreed to be a plaintiff brought again the company. The trial was held in Sioux Falls, SD, in 2013. The jury ruled in her favor, though awarded her no damages. Since then, over 20,000 victims of ovarian cancer and mesothelioma have brought lawsuits against J&J, and just recently, J&J agreed to remove its talc products from store shelves in the U.S. and Canada.
